KNOTS USED:

Lark's Head Knot
 Overhand Knot
 Half Hitch Knot

BEFORE STARTING

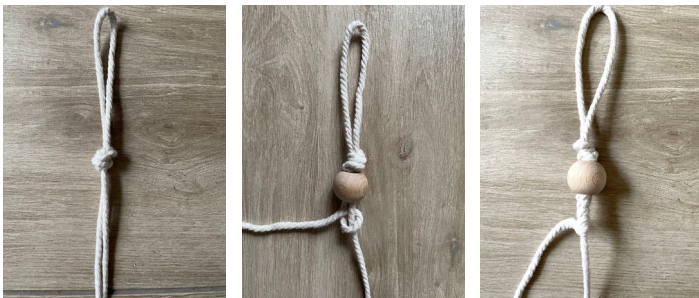
Cut the following:

- 1 x 1m rope colour 00105
- 1 x 25cm rope colour 00105
- 4 x 1.25m ropes colour 00105)
- 12 x 50cm rope colour 00105
- 12 x 50cm Gold Metallic yarn colour 00302
- 1 x 1.20m Gold Metallic yarn colour 00302
- 1 x 1m rope colour 00119
- 5 x 80cm ropes colour 00119
- 4 x 20cm ropes colour 00105

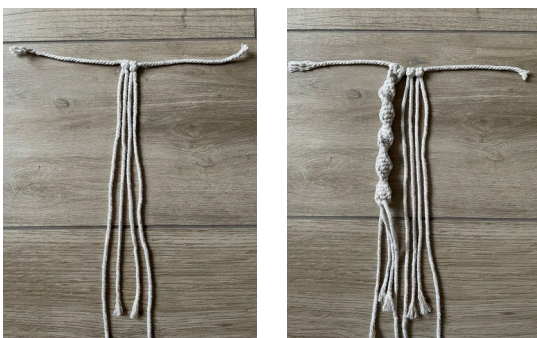
STEPS

STEP 1: Take 1 x 1m natural cord, fold in half and tie two Overhand Knots, creating a loop at one end. Make length of loop 8cm.

STEP 2: Using a darning needle, thread 1 x 22mm wooden bead onto the two strands of cord so that it sits directly under the Overhand Knots made in Step 1. Tie five Half Hitch Knots directly under the wooden bead.



STEP 3: Take 1 x 25cm natural cord and in the centre tie 2 x 1.25m natural cord using a **Lark's Head Knot**. Make sure the filler cords measure 25cm and the working cords 1m. Tie thirty-seven Half square knots. Repeat this, attaching to the same piece of 25cm natural cord.



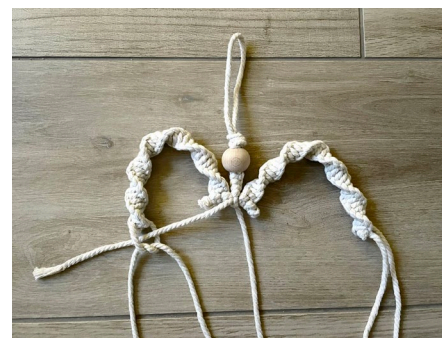
STEP 4: Tie an Overhand Knot directly next to each end of the Lark's Head Knots to secure. Cut excess cord. At the end of the Half square Knots, take the filler cords and tie an Knot to secure. Cut excess cord.



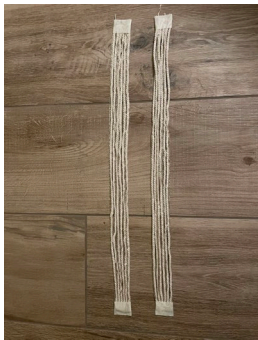
STEP 5: Take the Half Knots created in Step 3-4 and position into a V shape. Attach the piece created in Steps 1-3 and tie one Overhand Knot to secure together in the middle.



STEP 6: From the two cords in the middle, take the left cord and tie together the Half Knots using an Overhand Knot. Tie a second Overhand Knot to secure tightly. Do the same for the other side.



STEP 7: Take 6 x 50cm Natural cords and 6 x 50cm Gold Metallic yarn and attach masking tape at either end to secure. Fold the cords in half over the left side, between the wing and neck area. Do the same for the right side.



STEP 8: Place the decoration down flat with the back facing up. Take 1 x 1.20m Gold Metallic yarn and tie a Wrap Knot, securing the cords in Step 6. Remove the masking tape from the ends of the cords.



STEP 9: Use a comb and brush the cords below the Wrap Knot until they are frayed. Cut the cords in a straight line, to create a neat finish. You can cut to your desired length.



Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

WASHING ADVICE

Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible - up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets.

Do not bleach.

Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface.

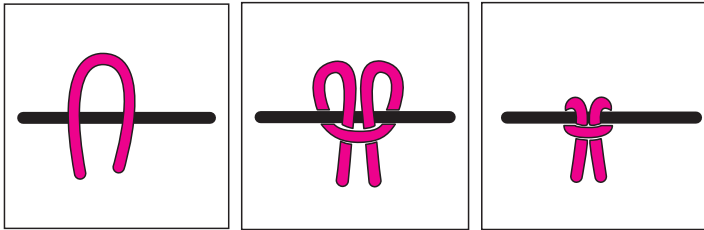

MACRAMÉ KNOTS TUTORIALS STEP BY STEP

LARK'S HEAD KNOT

- Step 1:** Fold one strand (consisting of a filler strand and a working strand) in half and place the loop on top of a cord, a rod or a ring.
Step 2: Fold the loop down the back
Step 3: Pull the ends of the strand through the loop and pull tightly.



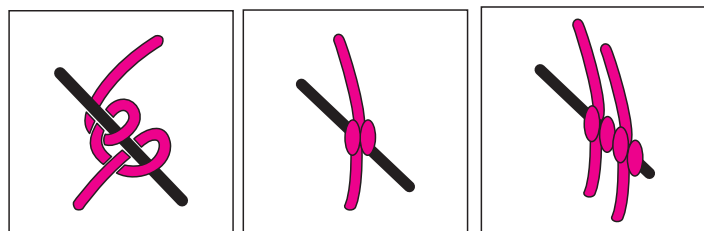

HALF HITCH

- Take the first cord on the left (black) as the filler cord and the second cord (red) as the working cord. Place the filler cord over the working cord. Loop the working cord around the filler cord.
Step 2: Loop the working cord around the filler cord again.



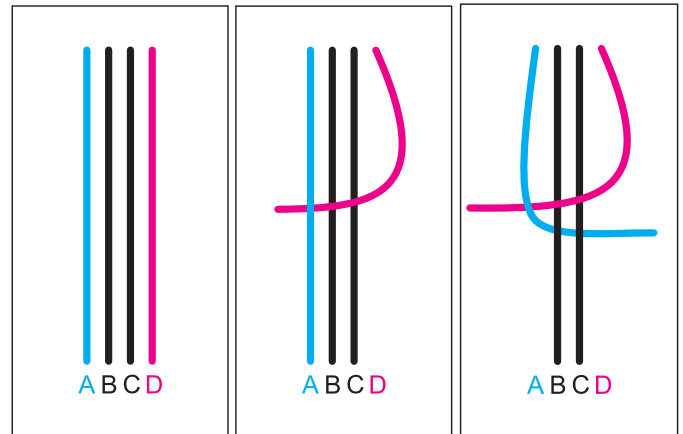

HALF SQUARE KNOT – SPIRAL SINNET

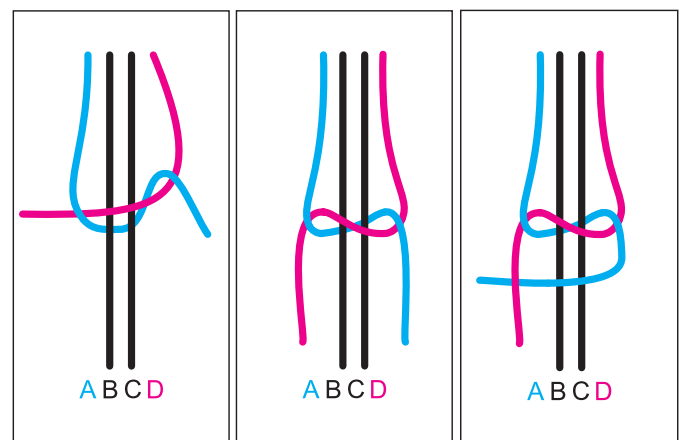
- Step 1:** The 4 filler and working strands are arranged parallel, the working strands A and D are on the outside and the filler strands B/C are in the middle.
Step 2: Place D from right to left over B/C and under A.
Step 3: Bring A from left to right under B/C.
Step 4: Pull A from the back to the front through the loop created by D.
Step 5: Carefully pull A and D tightly.
 The first basic knot is finished = 1 half square knot.
Step 6: Repeat the 1st basic knot placing A from right to left over B/C and under D.
Step 7: Bring D from left to right under B/C and pull from the back to the front through the loop created by A.
 Carefully pull A and D tightly.
 The first basic knot has been repeated = 2 half square knots.
Step 8: Repeat steps 1 to 7 to create a spiral sinnet.

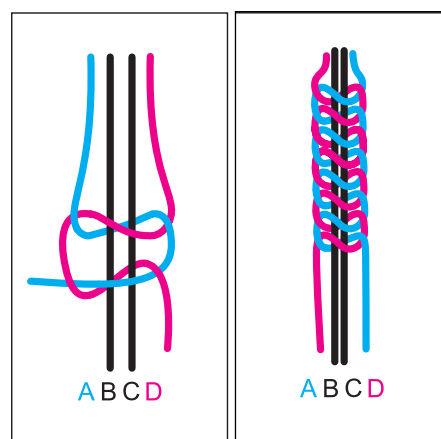

MACRAMÉ KNOTS TUTORIALS STEP BY STEP

WRAP KNOT

Step 1: The filler cords/strands should be arranged as parallel as possible in a bundle.

Step 2: Take a short cord (= wrapping cord) and create a loop approx. 5 cm long. Place the loop on top of the cord bundle.

Wrap the long end of the wrapping cord around the bundle of threads and the cord's own loop once and pull tightly.

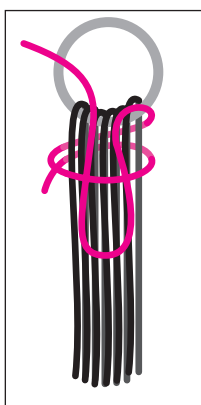
Step 3: Then continue to wrap the wrapping cord from top to bottom until the desired length of the gathering knot is achieved. Make sure that the wraps are close together.

To secure the wrapping cord, bring the end of it through its loop.

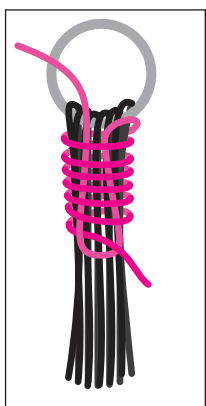
Step 4: Carefully tug on the beginning and the end of the wrapping cord until the loop disappears under the wraps. Cut the end of the wrapping cord.



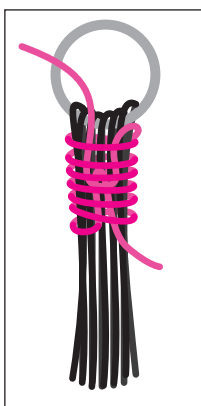

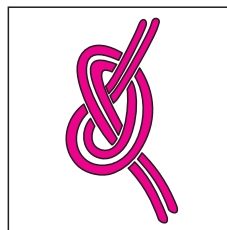
OVERHAND KNOT

The overhand knot can be made with one cord or with a group of cords.

Step 1: Take the end of the cord from the bottom to the top and bring it to the left behind the vertical cord.

Bring the end of the cord down through the loop you just created.

Pull the knot tight.
